DID YOU KNOW

The Center currently monitors water quality at seven sites throughout all three Inland Bays. Devices placed underwater called sondes (pictured right) collect data every 15 minutes. We measure the following from April-October:

- temperature
- specific conductivity
- dissolved oxygen
- pH
- turbidity
- chlorophyll

# SCIENCE & RESTORATION

## 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

- Expanded baygrass beds in Little Assawoman Bay through widgeon grass plantings. 150,000 seeds were planted in July, and an additional 420,000 seeds were planted in November as a result of two years of habitat monitoring.
- Planted **29 acres of forest** and **9 acres of meadows** throughout the watershed.
- Constructed the **Pasture Point oyster reef**, providing space for over **100,000 wild oysters**. This is the **largest oyster reef ever constructed in the Inland Bays**.
- Expanded the continuous water quality monitoring network to include Pasture Point, bringing our total site count to **7**.
- Published *Applied Nucleation for Forest Recovery in the Mid-Atlantic*, which serves as both a guide of “how to” implement applied nucleation, and, how to measure if a high-quality forest has been restored.
- Made improvements at the James Farm Ecological Preserve including: **trail enhancements, dune fencing, construction of the new Susie Ball Education Center, and upgraded maintenance buildings**.
- Set new Center records for oyster shell collections with over **7,300 bushels (225 tons)** of shell collected this year, **~405,000 pounds of shell recycled to create the Pasture Point Oyster Reef**, and additional oysters donated to support DNREC’s Millsboro Beneficial Use project.
- Fully transitioned volunteer program to digital software, Better Impact, recording **over 250 volunteers participating in over 30 different events**.
- **Repaired the eel ladder on a tributary to Rehoboth Bay** which ran from January-March. **Approximately 15,000 eels passed over the dam and into a local pond** via the ladder, eel mops, and manual capture. Eel mops were also deployed to evaluate the presence of eels at two different locations.

# OUTREACH & EDUCATION 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

- Historic gathering of Nanticoke Tribe members and Center staff to inaugurate plans for a restoration project at Thompson Island. This project aims to **protect the island from erosion** caused by wave energy and rising sea levels and includes the creation of a living shoreline to stabilize the island's shore, improve water quality, and provide habitat for fish, horseshoe crabs, terrapins, and other wildlife.
- In the latest Derelict Crab Pot Round-Up coordinated by DE Sea Grant, CIB staff helped mark and remove **54 total pots** from the Indian River.
- Co-hosted the 2024 Water Family Fest and Native Plant Sale with the Delaware

Department of Natural Resources and Environmental Control, with **attendance reaching nearly 500**.

- Provided interactive education booths at several community outreach events in 2024, such as the YES! Summit for high school students, Festival Hispano, and Coast Day, and reached well **over 500 people** through these efforts.



## EDUCATION PROGRAM BY THE NUMBERS

- **761 students reached in the Indian River School District last spring as the district relaunched outdoor education programs at their Ingram's Pond facility.** Center educators worked with nearly every 8th grade student from all four middle schools. This work continued in the fall of 2024 as the Center began to work with the 7th graders in the district.
- **53 learners hosted over two days at the 5th annual Journey Up the Coast**, in collaboration with Maryland Coastal Bays Program.
- **1,696 students reached (563 at the Preserve)\*** during this season's youth programs. The Center worked with both new and returning groups such as East Millsboro Elementary School, Club Sea Colony, Delmarva Christian Schools, South Coastal Library, Howard T Ennis School, and the Wilmington Green Jobs Program.
- **1,139 participants reached (790 at the Preserve)\*** during this season's public

programs. We hosted events with the Inland Bays Garden Center, the Bayside community in Selbyville, the South Coastal Library and Magee Farms in Lewes. Program topics included seining the Bays for creatures, identifying different bugs and animals you'd find in your garden, and the importance of estuaries.

- **694 students from Phillip C. Showell & Sussex Academy Elementary Schools participated in our year-long education program.** The students learned about sources, types, and impacts of marine debris and developed and implemented action plans to address marine debris in their communities.
- **10 students participated in a marine debris education program at Cupola Park.** Students learned about the **Inland Bays watershed, marine debris, engaged in a litter clean up, and kayaked.** 16 gallon buckets of litter were collected.

## WATERSHED & CONSERVATION

### 2024 HIGHLIGHTS

- Partnered with the Sussex Conservation District to help fund **1,000 acres of cover crops** in the Inland Bays watershed.
- **Assisted five communities** looking for information and resources to improve their resilience to climate change through the Resilient and Sustainable Communities League of Delaware.
- **Developed the Inland Bays Habitat Management Plan in collaboration with numerous integral partners.** This Habitat Plan identifies priority habitats throughout the watershed and will guide our future restoration and conservation efforts.
- Presented during 2 sessions at the Restore America's Estuaries conference.

# DEVELOPMENT



## 2024 HIGHLIGHTS:

- Spearheaded efforts to celebrate the **Center's 30th Anniversary all year long** through focused anniversary branding, cross-departmental coordination, and various events across the watershed culminating in the Grateful Shellabration with over 500 attendees.
- Created and launched **The Austin F. Okie Watershed Society**. This new giving opportunity will recognize people who have helped ensure the Center's lasting support for the watershed and its inhabitants through bequests, other planned giving, and/or lifetime contributions of \$50,000 or more.
- Partnered with **Bethany Brewing Company** and co-hosted a **successful inaugural Horseshoe Crab Hustle Run & Walk event** with over 300 participants, and we are back for year #2!
- As a partner of the inaugural **Inland Bays Oyster Week**, the Center hosted **'Arts on the Half-Shell'** pairing visual arts with culinary arts to illustrate the Center's work on **restoring oysters back to our Bays**.
- Reached out across the watershed to create awareness about the Center's mission, increase our number of supporters, and diversify our fundraising streams. The team participated in **over 30 events throughout 2024** to include Dine & Donate/Proceed events, signature Center-hosted events, multiple cleanups, and various unique community-centric events.
- Continued to explore new funding opportunities, and the Center **applied and was awarded two grants from the DE Community Foundation** in 2024.

# ADMINISTRATION & FINANCE

## 2024 HIGHLIGHTS:

- The James Farm Ecological Preserve was recognized as **Delaware's best free and open to the public greenspace by HGTV**. This honor highlighted the Preserve's habitat, public programs, and the updates to the Preserve's infrastructure.
- The Center was also voted the **Best Environmental Advocates in Sussex County by the readers of Coastal Style magazine** for 2024.
- The Center's **website redesign**, executed by D3Corp in Ocean City, won a **Fundraising and Communications Excellence (FACE) Award**, presented by the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP), DE Brandywine Chapter.

During the spring-fall of 2024, the Center was lucky to work with four amazing interns who contributed to various projects with Center staff and our partners. **We are grateful for their hard work!**



Jazz Petersen assisted staff with an exciting submerged aquatic vegetation (SAV) project, spent time on continuous water quality monitoring, longterm salt marsh monitoring, and helped with GIS for horseshoe crab and terrapin projects. Jazz also rocked it as our Center mascot, Nori, at our Grateful Shellabration event in November.



Matthew Buczik worked with Delaware Delicious Oysters on their aquaculture farm for 2-3 days a week. Matthew was also responsible for overseeing the construction of the oyster shell "burritos" that we used to create the Pasture Point Reef, and assisted with our living shoreline monitoring and pre-construction monitoring of the oyster reef site.



Logan Carey was a huge help this summer ensuring that our youth and public education programs ran smoothly and taught all participants about the importance of our Inland Bays. Logan even had the opportunity to create and lead his very own lesson about the tracks and traces of different animals at the Preserve.



Daniel Fulton was extremely helpful with our fish survey, transporting gear and helping volunteers pull nets and collect data. Daniel trekked through the muddy marsh to monitor habitat and wildlife, processed horseshoe crab survey data, and helped out at events including Discovery Bay and Journey Up the Coast.

Last summer, Center staff and Board members traveled to Legislative Hall in Dover as the **Delaware General Assembly passed a joint resolution honoring the Center's 30th Anniversary**. Center Board of Directors Secretary Aimee Isaac addressed Delaware Senators, stressing the importance of preserving, protecting, and restoring the Inland Bays.


