Jackie Knoll – Head Environment Educator

Overview of the Education Department which is a large part of the Comprehensive Conservation Management Plan (CCMP).

- James Farm Preserve is the center for delivering environmental educational programs with CIB. Hands on, real, world examples. Working on broadening reach to make programs more accessible from a distance.
- Types of programs:
- a) school programs (pre-K through 12); historically working with Indian River School system and working with Cape Henlopen, charter schools, and private schools to get as many children connected as possible. Goal is to reach 1-2K students.
- b) public programs held at James Farm Preserve over 500 so far in 2021, both youth and adult programs
- c) Journey up the Coast partnered with Maryland's Coastal Bays Program (also a National Estuary Program) all virtual events with learning boxes for hands-on-learning
- Surveying to learn about demographics and what is doing well; growing partnerships with schools for field trips; reaching new and diverse audiences throughout the watersheds
- James Farm Master Plan will round out and enhance the educational programs with infrastructure such as a three-season building, bathrooms, parking.
- Host 3-5 lectures as well
- Accessibility is key

 - o Resilient Communities & Economies
 - o Sustainable Fisheries & Aquaculture
 - o Environmental literacy & Workforce development
- Sea Grant is national with 24 programs
- David has a rich and varied career experience in marine education
- Environmental literacy need more informed decisions about environment and oceans (in particular); wind energy literacy is also important
- 15 second science concepts videos are important informational tools
- Extensive teacher professional development outreach conferences and workshops
- Chesapeake Bay Bowl student participation in competitions local, state, regional and national
