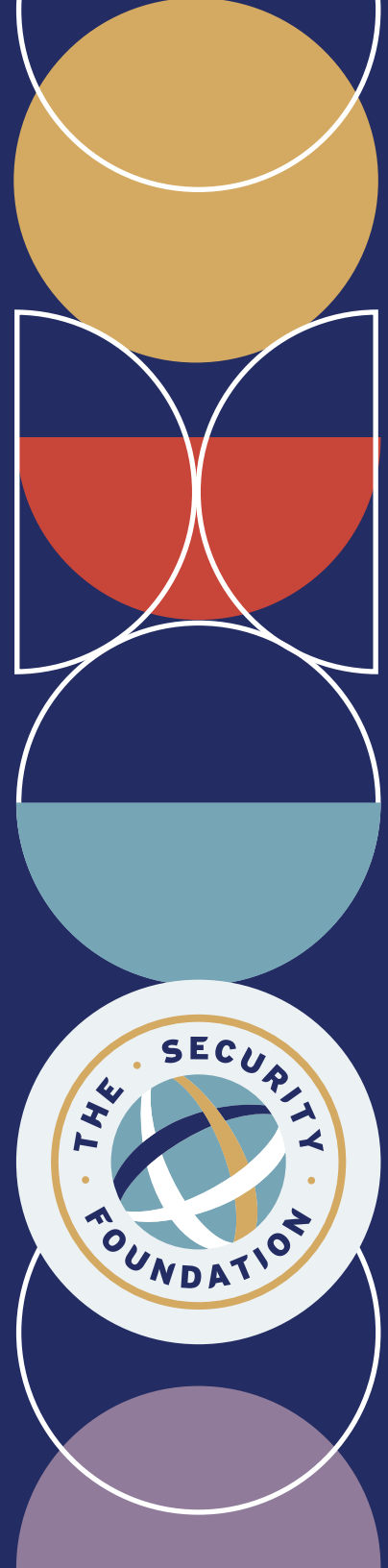

TSF takes an impartial approach to connecting public and private institutions and funding of key security programs and initiatives, paving the way for unbiased collaboration, unmatched cooperation, and an unwavering commitment to supporting U.S. interests and entities around the world today, tomorrow, and far into the future.

Who We Are

In 2011, visionary private-sector OSAC Council members recognized the need for an independent nonprofit to secure private-sector financial support to strengthen and expand OSAC programming. Today, as a 501 (c)(3) nonprofit, TSF provides financial resources for networking and information-sharing events for the U.S. Department of State's OSAC and the Domestic Security Alliance Council (DSAC) and its partnership with the FBI, DHS, and the private-sector security community. TSF also created a Nonprofit Grants program in 2020 and spearheads new initiatives to promote and advance the security profession.

The Solution

Since 2011, TSF has been instrumental in advancing public-private partnerships that strengthen U.S. security globally. TSF funds critical security programming, security-related nonprofits, and continuously launches new initiatives to expand the reach and effectiveness of the security industry.

To date, TSF has funded over 525 security events worldwide, fostering collaboration and information sharing between the public and private sectors. All OSAC and DSAC programs are free for participants to attend.

TSF's Board of Directors annually approves a budget that directs 80% of our program funding to support our public-private partners – OSAC and DSAC. The annual budget also includes 10% of program funding support for small security related non-profits and 10% to support TSF initiatives to promote and advance the security profession.

Over 800 OSAC and DSAC member organizations have contributed to TSF, helping to raise over \$12 million in financial support.

The Problem

Neither OSAC nor DSAC have government budgets to fund these vital public-private security information exchange programs. OSAC and DSAC have government funded program offices to organize and deliver these programs, but they are not funded to pay for the conferences, symposiums, webinars, networking events and other security information-sharing programs that they produce. Through the generosity of private-sector organizations, TSF has been able to fund over 525 public-private security exchange programs.

The Impact

From enhancing security practices to supporting critical initiatives, our funded programs have made a significant difference. We share data-driven insights and real-world stories to illustrate the tangible benefits of our efforts.
