# Year in Review

## TSF IMPACT

In 2025, The Security Foundation made several monumental advancements in both our internal operations and in how we serve the security community. Below are just a few of the highlights that have made 2025 so impactful:

### 600+ Programs Funded

We are thrilled to announce that we have surpassed over 600 programs funded since our inception. This incredible volume showcases the lasting impact TSF has made across a variety of security initiatives and underscores the critical role of our donors in making this possible.

### Security Coalition for Engagement & Advancement (SCEA)

The Security Community Partner Calendar (SCPC), a 2025 SCEA initiative, is a centralized hub for trusted in-person security events. The goal is to deconflict event schedules to reduce overlap, while increasing visibility and coordination across a more connected security community.

### Unified Fundraising and Annual Events

For the first time, TSF combined its fundraising campaign with the annual events cycle, raising **unrestricted support** rather than soliciting funds tied specifically to OSAC or DSAC. This streamlined approach increased flexibility for mission-driven investments across TSF programs and initiatives.

### OSAC + DSAC → Security Week

TSF convened the OSAC Annual Briefing and the DSAC Annual Meeting as a single, week-long **Security Week** – a sequence of joint plenaries, cross-sector working sessions, regional and sector forums, and targeted operational events – and celebrated **OSAC's 40<sup>th</sup>** and **DSAC's 20<sup>th</sup>** anniversaries. The integrated format deepened collaboration between domestic and global practitioners and created dozens of new operational connections.

# Security Coalition for Engagement and Advancement (SCEA)

In 2025, the Security Coalition for Engagement & Advancement (SCEA) continued to strengthen pathways for collaboration, career development, and community engagement across the security profession. Building on the momentum of last year's SCEA Summit, the Coalition laid the groundwork for its fourth annual Summit, scheduled for May 5, 2026, further establishing it as a premier forum for connection, learning, and cross-functional dialogue.

SCEA expanded its impact through the launch of the SCEA Resource Hub, a curated collection of credible, career-relevant, and accessible tools designed to support professionals at every stage of their careers. Guided by a framework prioritizing trusted sources, practical application, and long-term value, the hub emphasizes resources that are evidence-based, inclusive, and aligned to defined career pathways from education and entry into the profession through leadership development and specialization.

The Coalition also introduced the Security Community Partner Calendar (SCPC), a centralized platform highlighting in-person events across the security community. This resource improves visibility into key engagements, helps deconflict scheduling, and encourages collaboration across organizations, delivering greater value for both security event planners and attendees.

Looking ahead, SCEA is planning to deliver additional resources through its committee work, including a webinar focused on hard skills for early-career practitioners, curated book recommendations, a security job-mapping tool, a mid-career job search toolkit, and a primer for transitioning military and law enforcement professionals. Together, these planned efforts reflect SCEA's continued commitment to building a more connected, informed, and accessible security workforce.

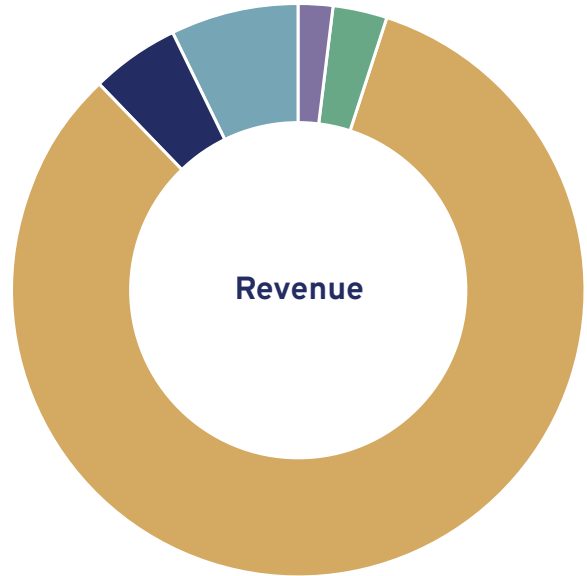

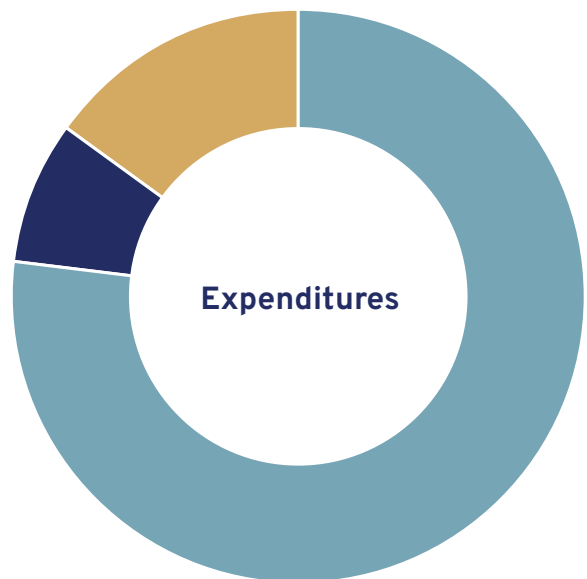

### Ambassador Nicholas Burns

*U.S. Ambassador to China (2021-2025) and  
Distinguished Leader in Global Diplomacy*



**The Security Foundation (TSF) is pleased to announce that Ambassador Nicholas Burns will serve as the keynote speaker at the upcoming TSF Annual Dinner.**

Ambassador Burns brings more than three decades of experience in U.S. diplomacy and international affairs, having served six Presidents and nine Secretaries of State across both parties. Most recently, he served as U.S. Ambassador to China (2021–2025), where he led a multi-agency mission advancing U.S. interests across a broad range of security, economic, and diplomatic priorities.

Throughout his career, Ambassador Burns has played a key role in strengthening international partnerships and navigating complex global challenges, including his leadership as U.S. Ambassador to NATO and his service at the National Security Council on Russia/Ukraine Affairs for Presidents George H.W. Bush and Bill Clinton.

His perspective reflects a deep commitment to public service and a longstanding focus on advancing collaboration across governments, institutions, and sectors.
