



Category 2: Imminently Homeless	
Individuals/families who:	
will imminently lose their primary nighttime residence within 14 days AND	
have no subsequent residence identified     AND	
<ul> <li>lack the resources or support networks needed to obtain other permanent housing.</li> </ul>	
Change: previously was a 7-day requirement	
Category 2: Imminently Homeless	
Primary Nighttime Residence:	
Housing they own

Category 3: Other Federal Statutes	
Unaccompanied youth under 25 or families with children and youth who do not otherwise qualify as homeless, but who:	
meet definition of homeless under another federal statute (see next slide); AND	
have not had lease, ownership interest, or occupancy agreement in permanent housing at any time during last 60 days; AND	
have experienced two or more moves during last     60 days; AND	
4. is expected to continue in such status for an extended period of time due to a special need or 2 or more barriers to employment.	


