#### **Screening recommendations High-Risk**

- → Consider referral to a breast specialist
- → Screening mammograms annually beginning as young as age 30
- → Screening MRI annually beginning as young as age 25
- → Breast self-awareness
- → Consider risk-reducing strategies (NCCN, 2024)

#### **Order the Correct Test**

Screening mammogram-

→ No known or suspected problem

#### Diagnostic mammogram

- → Also order an ultrasound for a suspected problem
- → Lump, nipple discharge, localized pain/discomfort, skin dimpling, nipple inversion, skin thickening peau d'orange, cracked/crusting on nipple

#### Risk-reduction in all women

- → Maintain a healthy weight (BMI <25)
- → Exercise (150-300 min/wk)
- → Manage stress
- $\rightarrow$  Avoid alcohol (none is better; <1/day & <3/wk)
- → Stop smoking
- → Breastfeeding (NCCN, 2024)
- → 4.3% risk reduction for every 12 months of breastfeeding (Cordeiro, 2014)

### Refer to a breast specialist

- → Dr. David Sechler MD, FACS, Tidal Health General Surgery
- → Carrie Kellams, DNP, FNP-BC, Tidal Health General Surgery

Increased surveillance/supplemental imaging

- → O6mo CBE
- → Breast MRI
- → Why not screening Ultrasound?

#### Oral endocrine therapy

→ Tamoxifen/AI

#### Prophylactic surgery (NCCN, 2024)
