Message from Bishop Mark Edington, Bishop in Charge of the Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe

This is a transcript of a message to the Episcopal Church in Colorado. It has been copied from their March 23, 2022 newsletter which was shared by The Rev. Penny Morrow.




Hello, Episcopal Church in Colorado. I'm really thankful

that Bishop Kym has invited me to say a few words to you from your brothers and sisters of the Episcopal Church in Europe. I'm Mark Edington. I'm the Bishop in charge of the Convocation of Episcopal Churches in Europe. 21 congregations of our church spread out across Europe from Paris in the West where our cathedral is to Tbilisi in Georgia in the

East.

Bishop Kym asked me to say a few words to you about the situation that's now unfolding in Ukraine. It is a disaster. There's no two ways about it. There are now 10 million Ukrainians who have fled from their homes and about four million of them are expected to be coming into Europe. The part of the Europe that we serve, that your church serves. That number actually may be a little low. We have no way of knowing.

Our April Book is *The Hiding Place* by Corrie Ten Boom which we will discuss on Monday, April 24 at 7pm via Zoom. It is an autobiographical memoir by Corrie Ten Boom, a devoutly religious woman who lived in the Holland city of Haarlem during the Nazi occupation. Compelled by her unshakeable Christian morality, she defied tyranny to rescue her Jewish neighbors who faced annihilation during the Holocaust. She was ultimately caught and sent to the notorious Ravensbruck death camp, where she witnessed scenes of unimaginable cruelty. In the camp, it was Corrie's bedrock faith in the glory of God that sustained her. She

discovered that love was a far more powerful force than hate—for God's love was truly unconquerable.


