The Shepherd's Crook has seen an increase in the number of clients now that COVID restrictions have lifted. During the first quarter of 2021 they served 1250 people. During that same period in 2022, they served 1843 people - an increase of almost 600.

At Christmas, the Ocean Cluster filled boxes of gifts and toiletries for the residents of the Hope4Recove House, a halfway house in Berlin for men in recovery from addiction. The Christmas gifts were so well-received that we decided to fill Easter baskets for them. We used festive Easter bags instead of the traditional baskets because we had so many items - socks, toiletries and, of

course, chocolate bunnies (and more). When they were full, we took them to the House, and the men were delighted. The Ocean Cluster continues their year round outreach with Hope4Recovery by preparing and delivering dinner one Sunday every month. Pre-Covid, we would stay and share the meal with them, but we can no longer do that. We are in hopes that one day in the not too distant future we will be able to resume the meals together. This is part of our mission to help the residents to re-enter society.


