Trinity Sunday is a Christian festival widely celebrated by Western Churches. It falls on the first Sunday after Pentecost, which is the 50th day after Easter. Trinity Sunday, in its essence, celebrates the mystery of faith and unity on and of the Holy Trinity: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit.

The observance of Trinity Sunday began in England when Thomas Becket became Archbishop of Canterbury on the first Sunday after Pentecost (Whitsunday). After his murder in 1170, Becket quickly became the most popular saint in the Western Church, and Trinity Sunday became a feast day throughout all of Europe.

#### June Is Alzheimer's & Brain Awareness Month

Worldwide, more than 55 million people are living with Alzheimer's or another dementia. Perhaps more alarmingly, that number is expected to reach 132 million by 2050.

Many Seniors Living With Alzheimer's Do Not Know They Have It: the early signs of dementia include

problems speaking or finding the right words during conversations, behavioral changes and difficulty with daily tasks like dressing. However according to the Alzheimer's Association, even after these symptoms are recognized by a health professional, only 45% of patients are told by their doctors of their diagnosis. The failure to disclose the diagnosis to patients and their caregivers can prevent seniors from receiving the early treatment they need.

Join the Alzheimer's Association in going purple and raising awareness this June. (Purple

is the official color of the Alzheimer's movement.) The more that people know about Alzheimer's, the more action we inspire.
