Jerusalem

Mark Jefferson posted the following on his Facebook page this morning.

After a harrowing and frustrating journey through London's Heathrow Airport (read the piece in the Wall Street Journal about how terrible the experience was), I landed in Tel Aviv, Israel. Living in the DMV area, imagine the irony of President Biden not only stopping traffic and flying overhead at home, but also now here in Jerusalem, as his lodging is near mine. Although his purpose is expanding the American geopolitical regime, I'm in



Jerusalem to preach at St. George's Cathedral on Sunday to preach sermon #200 of the Bicentennial Preaching Celebration. What started as a vision by Dean Markham, our seminary president, became a rallying call to promote and support preachers and preaching all over the world. Number 200 seemed like a desert oasis in October of 2018 and through pandemic, deep personal sacrifice, and the hospitality of so many, we have arrived at our goal.

Over the course of this journey I have met many people from churches from Cape Town to Jerusalem to Honolulu. I preached at the Alexandria Detention Center and at my grandma Pat's funeral. I cried with people who found the isolation of pandemic unbearable and laughed with young people at St. Alban's School in Washington, DC and St. Margaret's School in San Juan Capistrano, CA. I feel richer by teaching many preaching workshops with lay preachers, deacons, and pastors/rectors. They teach me so much! I feel indebted to the many pockets of hospitality that gave me rest, hope, and love.

You would imagine that any great feat is accomplished by the help of so many. I thank my family and friends for lending me to the world so that I can pursue what so relentlessly burns in my heart, to substantially help people and preach. I want to thank my colleagues who believe in this work, support it, and mean me well. My students are the best, and they know how much I love and appreciate them. Coming to Jerusalem and touring Israel is opening my eyes all the more and changing my life with each site visit.

Some people asked me about what's next. The school's 200 anniversary is next year so I think we can get another few sermons in before next October. Also, we may create a cohort or two to bring to Jerusalem in 2024. I'll keep y'all posted.

Shout out to my man Joseph for the great tour through the Old City of Jerusalem. Today's tours of Jericho and Bethany are life-changing. Like when I was in Cape Town, I sense something great afoot and I'm honored to be part of God's plan.

Putting in work on the continents, giving God the glory, and bringing the best students to Virginia Theological Seminary. What's better than that?


