

Ocean City Pride Parade

Ocean City's First Annual Pride Parade will take place next Saturday, June 24th, 10am-Noon, beginning on the Boardwalk at 1st Street. St. Paul's by-the-Sea will be participating in this event and welcomes everyone to join our presence there. If you cannot be with us in-person that day, we will also be in need of your prayers - prayers for everyone's safety and prayers that our presence provides the welcome and acceptance that the LGBTQ+ community needs to feel from us as God's people.

Our next book selection is "The Personal Librarian" by Marie Benedict and Victor Christopher Murray. This story is an historical fiction tale of Belle da Costa Greene, an African American woman who served as personal librarian for J.P. Morgan. Goodreads.com gives the following synopsis:

In her twenties, Belle da Costa Greene is hired by J. P. Morgan to curate a collection of rare manuscripts, books, and artwork for his newly built Pierpont Morgan Library. Belle becomes a fixture on the New York society scene and one of the most powerful people in the art and book world, known for her impeccable taste and shrewd

negotiating for critical works as she helps build a world-class collection.

But Belle has a secret, one she must protect at all costs. She was born not Belle da Costa Greene but Belle Marion Greener. She is the daughter of Richard Greener, the first Black graduate of Harvard and a well-known advocate for equality. Belle's complexion isn't dark because of her alleged Portuguese heritage that lets her pass as white—her complexion is dark because she is African American.

The Personal Librarian tells the story of an extraordinary woman, famous for her intellect, style, and wit, and shares the lengths to which she must go—for the protection of her family and her legacy—to preserve her carefully crafted white identity in the racist world in which she lives.

- Approved the minutes May 15, 2023
- Pastor Jill thanked Jody, Don & Shirley for their support during the initial phase of her transition and praised them



for their commitment to the parish.

- Pastor Jill announced her Celebration of New Ministry is scheduled for Saturday, September 9 at 1:00 p.m. at church.
- Pastor Jill reported that she will be using a tutor to help improve her conversational Spanish.
- Tom Shuster gave an update the Vestry Goals and Objectives for 2023-2024.
- Bob Rothermel reported that the Church sign on Baltimore Avenue has been refurbished and reinstalled.
- Bob met with the cleaning contractors to review the scope of their work. Following discussion, the Vestry authorized Bob to continue using the contractors at a revised hourly rate while he conducts additional research on cleaning options.
- John Knotts presented the Treasurer's report. The Vestry discussed funding for Shepherd's Crook.
- Cheryl Nottingham reported the next Finance Committee meeting is set for Monday, July 24. Cheryl conferred with John Knotts, Tom Shuster & Pastor Jill to discuss the monthly transfers from the ECF accounts to the operating budget.
- The draw from the ECF accounts was increased to \$21,000 per month effective June.
- Amanda Cropper reported that the Altar Guild has purchased a new green chasuble.
- Vestry received written report from Communications and the 2023 Worship Schedule.
- Vestry set the next regular meetings for Monday, July 17 and Monday, August 21 at 5:30 p.m. at church.
