Welcome and Introductions	 Crissy Bowie-Simpson welcomed attendees and everyone introduced themselves. Penny Walters approved February meeting minutes and Stephen Silberman carried. Meeting minutes were then unanimously approved as written. 	
Local Behavioral Health Authority (LBHA) Presentation- <i>Jessica Taylor</i>	 Please see Powerpoint attached to email for full details on presentation. The LBHA provides assistance to local area providers as well as those seeking services in our community. Key takeaways LBHA can provide Mental Health First Aid Trainings for community partners. Adult or Youth trainings are available. Virtual, blended and fully in person options are offered. Client support funding is available for individuals in the community who are involved in the public behavioral health system. They must be 18 years old and receiving some type of therapy. The mental health provider needs to be the one to complete the application. This funding can be received one time in a one year period up to 1,000.00. There must be evidence that income is greater than expenses and that the individual would be able to sustain the expense moving forward. Applications can be faxed or emailed in and a coordinator has 10 days to determine if eligible. Funding is also available for individuals in recovery who need assistance with glasses, dental or medical devices. You can access that form here

FY25 MOOR Block Grant	 Wicomico County will be receiving approximately \$110,000 in FY25 through the MOOR Block Grant program. Crissy Bowie-Simpson shared that these funds support the Opioid Coordinator salary, the Operations section chief, training, education and informational campaigns. This includes trainings for OPT partners, and supports Go purple efforts. Funding has supported a well-known speaker the last 2 years as well. In FY25 the Operations Section chief position will be discontinued. This was a difficult position to fill and adjustments will be made as a result of the discontinuation. Crissy suggested the idea of a professional conference for FY25, and solicited feedback from the group. The group shared the following ideas: Opioid Forums/educational panels like we have had in the past was recommended by Jessica Taylor. 	





	 Mental Health First Aid for teens was also suggested by Dr Katherine Jones. It was suggested that health educators in the school could provide these types of trainings and information. Crissy shared this curriculum would be about 60k. Meredith mentioned that some of this information is covered in the school system. Nick Thompson is the supervisor of Health education and would be the best person to discuss this with. Tammy Griffin shared that the beginning of the school year is a great time to start these types of conversations. Stephen Silberman shared he liked the idea of the OPT partner conference, and that maybe the school system could be invited. 	
Agency Updates	 <i>Coastal Hospice- SOBS</i> They are still hosting groups at RRC in Salisbury. They are looking at other locations to hold groups in other counties. <i>Salisbury Fire Department</i> no updates at this time. <i>Recovery Resource Center</i> They are hosting the Coastal Hospice SOBS groups. They would like to make more people aware of this resource. They will be hosting a Sober St Patrick's Day party on 3/16/24 from 130-400pm. There will be food and a costume contest. They also have BINGO, video game night, a BBQ, a comedy show and bowling coming up over the next few months. They are currently working on a new Strategic Plan. They host a "Girls Gone Mild" group which is a non-denominational recovery group designed for women. This is not a 12-step meeting, but is recovery focused. Will be starting a NarAnon group in the future. They had 42k people attend meetings and events last year. OPT Related Updates	 Stephen Hill, a speaker in recovery, will be speaking at both Wi-Middle and Wi-Hi in April. There will also be a community event on 4/8/24 at Wor-Wic Community College. Doors open at 5:30 and the event starts at 6pm. Light refreshments will be served and door prizes will be provided. Currently still working on building an abatement plan for the Opioid Restitution Funds. Funding will be able to support increased access to Naloxone through vending machines. Have also reached out to Wic Co Public 	
	 the last 5 have been fatal. At this time they are waiting on autopsy reports to know which substances were responsible. She did say that a trend she is seeing is a mix of cocaine and fentanyl. The group shared that they believe the community should be educated on this. Crissy Bowie-Simpson will reach out to Matthew to inquire about doing a press release on this topic.
