Welcome and Introductions	 Jessica Sexauer welcomed attendees and everyone introduced themselves. Jovan Twilley approved October meeting minutes and Lisa Campbell seconded. Meeting minutes were then unanimously approved. 	
Overdose Prevention Coordinator Transition	• Michelle Hardy updated the group and informed them the new OPT Coordinator, Juleanna Willis, will start on 11/13/24 three days per week. She will be in the position full time by January 2025.	
Recap on Tri- County Go-Purple Event	• Tri-County Goes Purple Kick-Off event was held on 8/31/24 at the Shorebirds Stadium. There were 4,209 attendees at the game. Need to decide if we will have the Tri-County Kick-Off in 2025. The cost will be \$5,500 for the event, and we would look at August 22nd, or September 6th.	
Opioid Restitution Fund Community Grant	 Michelle Hardy reported having a RFP open to locate a vendor to supply and maintain at least six (6) harm reduction vending machines around Wicomico County. A pre-proposal meeting is scheduled for November 19th. Matthew reported the Non-Litigating Municipality RFP received no community applications. RFP has closed. If anyone is interested in utilizing these funds for a project to combat the opioid epidemic please reach out to Hope Balam, or Matthew McConaguhey. Matthew reported the targeted abatement plan has been sent to the County Executive's team for review and approval. Once it has been approved it can be submitted to the MOOR office. 	
Residential service Needs Assessment	Jessica Sexauer reported Wicomico County LBHA has secured funding to complete a needs assessment for residential services to support pregnant women, and women with children. The health	





	department will be working with BEACON on this project and there is a meeting next week to review and discuss possible survey questions, focus group questions, and key informant interview questions. Please reach out to her if there are any thoughts on questions that would support this project.

Agency Updates	 Department of Social Services Held Substance Exposed Newborn conference took place October 30 at the Marriott Salisbury. It was about building partnerships between DSS, Healthy Families America program, and the BOE Birth to Five program. It went well and was nice for networking purposes. There are new statewide initiatives for foster care. The new initiative makes Maryland a kin first state. Draft regulations have been sent out for public comment and will go into effect January 2025. Wor-Wic Community College Penny reported planning activities for next semester. Trying to secure funding to bring Tony Hoffman to the area. She will not know until January if funding will be secured to bring him to the area, but he is interested in coming.
